
that all Kansans—regardless of location—have access to quality, enriching programming.

FIRST BOOK GLUB

In FY25, Smoky Hills PBS distributed 4,707 FREE books to children across our viewing area. These books were provided during the school day to children enrolled in public preschools and Head Start programs, thanks to the generous support of partner foundations throughout our region. In many classrooms, teachers incorporated the books into their lessons, making them a valuable tool for early literacy and learning.



PRS KIDS WRITTERS GONTIEST

In 2025, the Smoky Hills PBS KIDS Writers Contest had an inspiring impact, with over 100 creative story submissions from children across our viewing area. This annual contest encourages young writers in grades 1 through 5 to use their imaginations to write and illustrate their own original stories. A panel of judges selected the top three entries in each grade level, celebrating the talent, creativity, and hard work of these young authors. The contest not only promotes literacy and storytelling skills but also empowers children to express themselves and take pride in their accomplishments.



During the summer of 2025, Smoky Hills PBS visited 82 libraries across our coverage area to encourage reading through our Share A Story program, themed around Curious George. Each child received a FREE book, and we distributed over a thousand books expanding the home libraires to families throughout our viewing area.
